

GWHS Hosts Veteran's Day

Veteran's Day is something special around George West High School. With the efforts of Mr. Richard Waterhouse, Kristy Keach, Barbara Bednorz, Heather Lee, Mickey Southard, Bridget Emerson & Student Council, Mike Williamson, Nat McReynolds and the Longhorn Band, a large audience of about 400 people paid tribute to a special group. Each year, students stop classes and gather together to recognize some of our Nation's Finest who served our country nobly. This year was no exception.

Veterans from all walks of life filed into the new activity center to reflect, remember, and to be appreciated. GWHS Principal, Richard Waterhouse, retired Colonel in the US Army, opened the ceremony by welcoming students, staff, visitors, and especially, veterans. Student Council President, Landry Keith, read the beautiful poem, "Old Glory", and Lawson Henicke, Student Council Vice President, read "Veterans Day".

Guest speaker, Commander Nathaniel Mauer, who served in the US Marine Corp and is currently serving in the US Navy as a flight instructor, spoke eloquently of the selfless sacrifice those in uniform have given. "As we give thanks to Veterans, it is the sacrifice and their greatness that we are grateful for. It is the missed Thanksgiving dinner because they were the one on duty all night. It is being deployed during Christmas and unable to watch their kids open presents. It is the missed birthdays and anniversaries, or the birth of their child who they won't get to meet for a few more months until they get home." Commander Mauer went on to describe serving, "It is not being able to tuck in a child or read them a story. It is not being able to just pick up a phone and hear the voice that you wanted to hear."

Mauer also added thoughts about the darker side of serving. "And then, there are the things they cannot forget, or cannot leave behind, or the parts of them that got left behind, or the friends that they won't be bringing back. The sounds and feelings that won't go away. The dodging of trash on the side of the road. The smell or sound that triggers a memory. The sleepless nights or bad dreams."

Mauer closed with, "It's not an easy job to be called a Marine, a Soldier, a Sailor, an Airman, or a "Coasty", but it's one we are proud of..."

The audience was silent as they reflected on Mauer's words. One couldn't help but choke back the inner gratefulness and appreciation for these veterans. They are a special breed. Heroes.


One of the final moments of the ceremony, was the recognition and honoring of the "Hometown Heroes" who have and are currently serving in the military. Photos and bios flashed across the big screens as individuals were recognized. Some are still serving, some have since retired, and some have gone Home to Glory.

The George West High School Band played "Marches of the Armed Forces"—a medley of songs representing the individual branches of the military. Veterans stood and were recognized, once again, during their particular song. During each song, the high school color guard presented the appropriate military branch flag. The pomp and ceremony within these few bars of music stirs the soul.


As students were dismissed from the program, one by one, each student filed past these people of honor, they shook hands, hugged a neck, and thanked them. It was a remarkable sight.





WORKING TOGETHER FOR SCHOOL SUCCESS

Secrets to better behavior

You know what they say: An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. That's true when it comes to effective discipline, too. Try these ideas for heading off problems.


***Notice triggers** – Being aware of what causes misbehavior goes a long way towards preventing it. Perhaps your youngster acts out when he's tired – make sure he's getting 9-11 hours of sleep. Or maybe he misbehaves when he's bored. Let him write a list of activities for when there's "nothing to do" (examples: play solitaire, finger paint, do a puzzle).

***Offer choices** – Give your child some control in situations where he struggles to behave. Does he typically whine while you're running errands? Consider letting him pick the order in which you do them. Is it hard to get him to dress up for a family event? He might like to choose the color of his shirt or pick out a pair of fun socks to wear.

***Be a coach** – Coaches demonstrate, encourage, and celebrate. Why not use this approach for behavior you want your youngster to change? If he should be putting dirty clothes in the hamper, for instance, "coach" him on tossing in his t-shirts. He'll see that it's more fun to "make a basket" than to drop clothes on the floor. When you find his floor free of dirty clothes the next time, give him a high five.

PARENTS: Turning Off Cell Phone

Like most of us, we tend to pull out our phones frequently to check emails, text friends, or look at Facebook. Our phones can distract us from conversations we have with our children and the rest of our families. Not only is it impolite, but it keeps us from really hearing things our children are saying to us! Our children are much more important than our cell phones and we are setting an example for them. Please be aware and more considerate. Our families deserve our full attention and need it!!!


